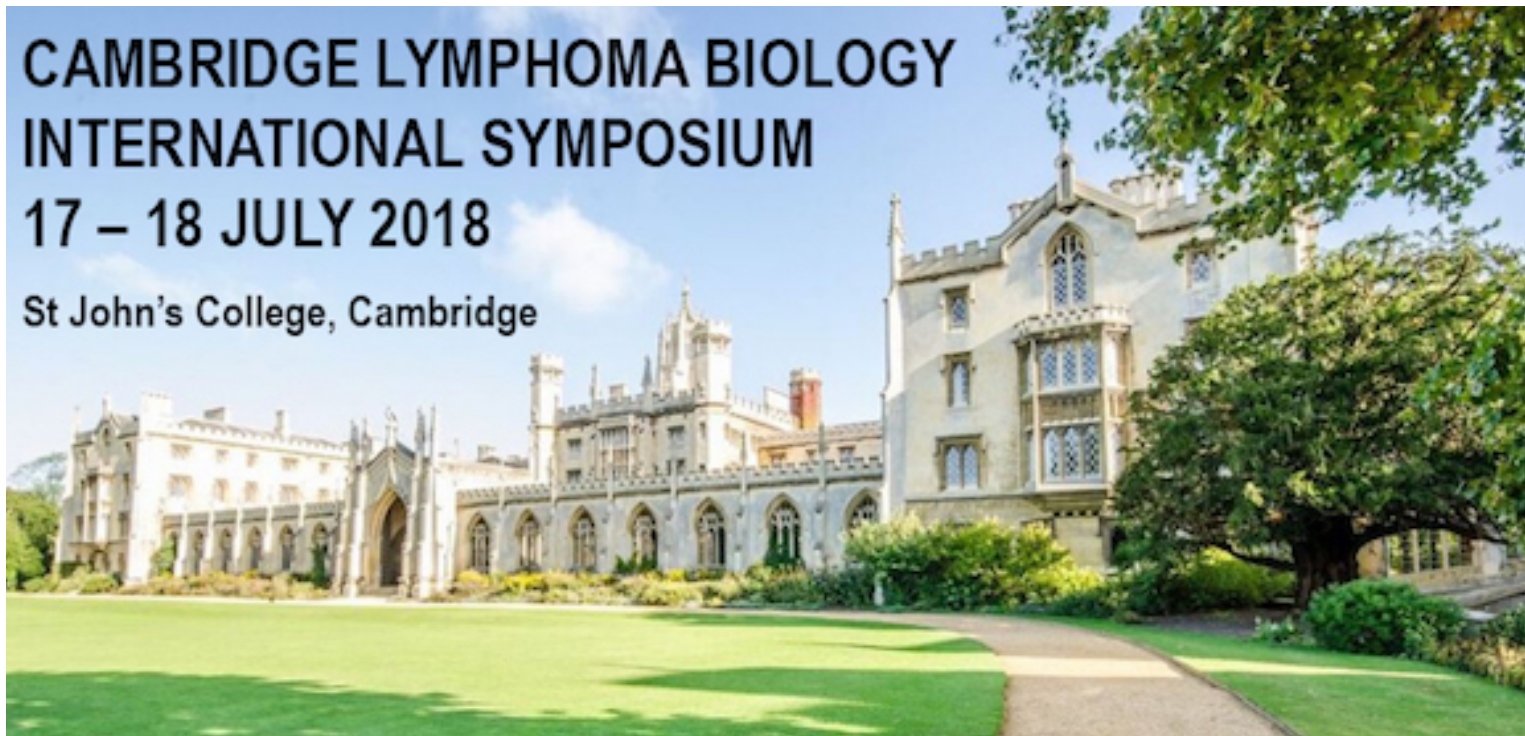

The **Cambridge Lymphoma Biology International Symposium** brings together research scientists and clinicians with an interest in the biology of lymphoma and CLL. This two-day symposium will be held in St John's College in the heart of Cambridge, UK. It features a programme of expert speakers from across the world as well as selected oral presentations from submitted abstracts. Poster sessions include "flash" poster presentations from PhD students with a generous prize awarded for best poster. Topics covered include the genomics and functional genomics of lymphoid malignancies, the biology of the germinal centre, the role of haematopoietic stem cells in lymphomagenesis, RNA biology, tumour microenvironment, precision medicine and novel therapeutics. The registration fee includes a drinks reception and gala dinner in the historic hall of St John's College.
