

Lectures 2026: request for nominations for the Samuel Gee, Fitzpatrick, and Croonian lectures

Samuel Gee Lecture

Established by a bequest from Miss Edith Thyra Gee, received in 1964 – in memory of her father, Dr Samuel Jones Gee FRCP (1839–1911): £30,000 to be applicable to the general purposes of the College. The Samuel Gee lecture is typically given at College Day (April). The honorarium for the Samuel Gee lecture is £115 and the lecture may be given on any topic.

Fitzpatrick Lecture

Founded by a gift from Mrs Agnes Letitia FitzPatrick, received in 1901, confirmed by deed 1930 – in memory of her husband Dr Thomas FitzPatrick MRCP (1832–1900): £2,000 to endow a lectureship in 'The History of Medicine', the precise subject to be announced beforehand and the lectures to be printed and published in a separate book. The lectures are delivered by a Fellow of the College appointed by the President and Censors and the same fellow may be appointed two years in succession, but not again until an interval of at least one year has elapsed.

The honorarium is £115 and the lecture is given on the history of medicine, to be delivered by an RCP fellow.

Croonian Lecture (Sadleir trust)

Established by a bequest from Lady Sadleir, wife of Sir Edwin Sadleir Bt and widow of Dr William Croone (1633–84), Fellow of the College. The College's lecturer is appointed by the Censors; honorarium 100 guineas (now £105). The lecture is given on any aspect of medicine or surgery, to be delivered by an RCP fellow.
